

# PHYSICAL ACTIVITY POLICY

This physical activity policy supports the curriculum for PE. The policy informs and reflects practice throughout the school day, including travel to and from school.

# AIM

To increase the activity levels of the whole school through the provision of a supportive environment that is conducive to the promotion of physical activity.

#### **Raising the Physical Activity Profile**

- Achievement is regularly celebrated and activity promoted in assemblies.
- Parents are regularly invited to both take part in (e.g. Olympic day/sports day) and observe activities.

## **Play-time activity**

- Physical activity is promoted during breaks and lunchtimes and pupils are encouraged to be more active at these times
- A range of equipment is available to all pupils during play-time.
- Safe, appropriate and stimulating playground areas are provided in which children can play and be active

#### Curriculum

- The PE programme is broad and balanced, complies with statutory requirements, is accessible to and meets the needs and interests of all pupils
- Physical activity and health related exercise are promoted within other lessons e.g. the effect of exercise on the body, anatomy and physiology, in science.
- An annual programme of intra school activities is provided for all pupils, including a sports day.

## **Out of School Hours Activity**

- A diverse weekly programme of out-of-school-hours activity clubs is provided, which suits the needs of all pupils.
- A programme which offers an equal balance of competitive and non-competitive activities is provided.
- Appropriately qualified professionals are invited to contribute to the provision of out-of-hours activities

#### Inclusion

- We aim to ensure that pupils with specific disabilities and/or health problems take a full and active part in physical activity opportunities offered both within and outside school.
- Physical activity provision within this school is developmentally appropriate and a variety of teaching and learning approaches are adopted

#### School Sport Partnership and Community Links

- The school regularly participates in School Sport Partnership events.
- The school employs a range of auxiliary qualified and experienced coaching staff and implements quality assurance through the PLT/SSP (Primary Link Teacher / School Sport Partnership) programme.
