Reading is Important

All pupils have a reading book which must be kept in their reading bag or folders and brought into school <u>every day</u>; they will need to change the book every Friday.

It is very important that your child brings in their book every day as we often provide opportunities to read in class. Pupils can change their book when they have finished it.

Pupils may also take a book from the book corner every week. A new book can be taken home only if the previous one is returned.

Please encourage your child to read, each day sit with them and talk to them about their book. They need to understand what they are reading – not just be able to read the words.

Try taking your child to the local library, it's free to join and borrow books.

Breakfast Club

Breakfast Club takes place every day in the KS2 Hall from 8am to 9am at a cost of £2 per day. Call at the school office to arrange a place for your child.

Home learning

Times tables and weekly spellings will be sent home and tested weekly at school. These need to be practised each night so that your child is fully prepared.

Thank you for continuing to support you child with their homework activities each night.

• Year 4 have P.E. on Mondays and Wednesdays. Please make sure they have their P.E. kits including trainers/plimsolls with them on these days and that it is not worn under their uniform. Jewellery must not be worn at school except for stud earrings which must be removed or covered with plasters for P.E.

- Please ensure ALL of your child's clothing and shoes are labelled with their name. It is your child's responsibility to keep their belongings safe.
- Remember school starts at 9.00am don't be late! Pupils may bring a bottle of water to drink during the day.
- Please make sure that your child is wearing appropriate clothing for the weather conditions (coat, hat, scarf, gloves etc.)

PSHCE

Health and Wellbeing Think Positive

Children will build on what they have already learnt about feelings and how our attitude towards life can affect our mental health. To include themes such as thinking positively, managing difficult emotions and taking responsibility for decisions.

RE

What Makes me the Person Lam?

Children are given the opportunity to reflect on different aspects of their identity, on ideas about what is distinctive about them, and what they share with others and the world around them.

FRENCH

Grammar focus: Adjectives – singular and plural
Children will learn the names of buildings and places
typically found in towns. They will also further
develop their conversational French to include asking
for and giving directions.

SCIENCE

Animals Including Humans

Children will describe the digestive system and explore the functions of human teeth. They will construct and interpret a variety of food chains, identifying producers, predators and prey.

ART

Print this

Artist: William Turner, John Constable, Caspar Friedrich and others.

Technique: relief printing on polystyrene. **Skills**: sketching, drawing on polystyrene, inking with

a brayer, printing.

This half term the Year 4 students will explore printing as an artistic technique. They will learn how to do relief printing by carving into a polystyrene sheet. They will also look at what landscape is and how it is represented by different artists.

COMPUTING

E-safety

Through discussion the children will learn how to stay safe online. The children will be given specific questions to discuss individually and as a group. The children will then create a caption with a speech bubble to show what they have learnt.

Scratch - Maze Game

Scratch is a programming language where children can program interactive media such as stories, games, and animation. As children create with Scratch, they learn to think creatively, work collaboratively, and reason systematically. Children to use Scratch to create a simple maze game. Children will look at modern and retro games in order to create a fun new game. This unit will develop their knowledge of Scratch and deepen their understanding. Children to continue to use language such as algorithms/debugging/sprite etc.

PE

Tag Rugby

Children will be able to: elect and use the most appropriate skills, actions or ideas; move and use actions with coordination and control; keep possession of the ball and move to find a space when they are not in possession during a game;

Health and Fitness

Children will be able to explain why keeping fit is good for their health.

Music

Bring us together Ukulele

Children learn how to read music whilst developing their instrumental skills on the Ukulele and classroom percussion instruments.

They will focus on pitch, dynamics, tempo, timbre, structure, rhythm and texture when playing the Ukulele.

GEOGRAPHY

The Water Cycle, Coasts and Rivers in the UK

By the end of the unit, children should have a sound understanding of the water cycle and the role of rivers and coasts within this process. Children will be taught the stages of the water cycle and the journey of the river as it flows across the land. They will also be discussing some of the uses of the river and the resultant river pollution that can be caused as a consequence to these uses. They will be able to explain the importance of rivers and coasts to their communities and discuss the preventions in place to control and manage the water level.
