CONTEXT	Newspaper article on the mysterious happenings. Newspaper article – something topical. Character description of the Canterville ghost and the setting.	Speech to persuade father to be a firework maker Letter persuading the King to stop abusing the elephant. Comedy/ Farce- Rewrite the kidnap scene.	Diary entry from Lucy. Magical setting Character description – new character based on the fawn. Narrative - Mythical Story based on above	Script – News report on tornadoes. Explanation text- Design tornado shelter Tutankhamun – Newspaper Article	Persuasive writing - which character should get their wish (from Wizard of Oz). Or persuasion based on Alice in Wonderland, e.g. persuading the Queen of Hearts to be kinder to her subjects Non-Chronological Report (Tower of London)	Write a report on an animal. Possibly use “Ants at Home” (see Reading plan) as a stimulus. Balanced argument about being quiet and a daydreamer or loud and confident.
